**Who can apply?** Applicants must be at least 21 years old and 4-H volunteer who has completed Volunteer Orientation. Applicants must be in good health. (Sleep deficit, some lifting and much walking are common).

**What are the requirements?** Application and Agent Recommendation must be received at the state office by <u>February</u> 15, 2018, to be considered.

Come join the excitement of this brand new opportunity available to some of our youngest (and often most enthusiastic!) 4-H members!



#### YOUTH MUST BE 12 YEARS OLD AT THE



#### A Special Note To Parents

During 1998, the Governor signed a law establishing a minimum age limit of 12 for youth to enroll in the Wisconsin Certification Program. This means that a youth must be 12 years old in order to enroll in the course for the intent of certification.

One parent or guardian <u>must</u> accompany his/her child to the first session. A short presentation on parent responsibility will be conducted at the beginning of this session.

This five week course meets state and federal requirements of 24 hours of training. To fully meet the requirement, 100% attendance is expected.

Course materials and a written exam are targeted at youth who are 13-15 years old. Youth are also evaluated on how well they are able to reach and operate tractor controls on a simulated course during a driving exam.

Maximum enrollment is 20 students minimum to hold the class is 10.

Meals are <u>NOT</u> provided. Please make sure the youth has packed an adequate snack.

#### 2018 Tractor Safety Course

In 2018, the Tractor and Machinery Certification Course will be conducted on six (6) consecutive Saturdays beginning on February 17, 2018.

Testing will be conducted on March 24th, at the JP Coughlin Building, Room B.

Meals are <u>NOT</u> provided. Please make sure the youth has packed an adequate snack.

The Tractor and Machinery Certification Course is taught by adult volunteers from the Winnebago County area to meet the following objectives:

- To provide youth with the means to develop positive attitudes toward tractor and machinery safety.
- To provide youth with education on the basic principles of tractor and machinery safety.
- To allow youth to acquire basic knowledge, ability and to develop safe work practices in the use of tractors and machinery.
- To provide youth with education on how to identify and correct agricultural work hazards.
- To provide youth with basic knowledge of farm chemicals and electrical safety.
- To provide youth with basic first aid/first response information in the event of an accident

#### Assessing Your Child's Ability To Drive A Tractor Or Operate Machinery:

1. Age of Child

#### 2. Physical Abilities

- Can the youth sit securely in the operator's seat and fully depress clutch and reach all controls?
- On seats with seatbelts, the child should be able to reach all controls.
- Does the child have the strength needed to shift, steer or hook equipment up to the tractor?
- Is the child able to turn and check behind them for traffic and still keep the tractor in control?

#### 3. Cognitive Abilities

- Is your child able to recognize dangerous situations like driving too fast or turning too sharp?
- Is he/she able to think through situations quickly to avoid hazards?
- When given directions does the child follow them?
- If the child has difficulty paying attention for 15 minutes in a class, what could happen if his/her mind wanders while driving down the road?

#### 4. Emotional maturity

- Does peer pressure cause him/her to show off or attempt things beyond their ability?
- Does the child become easily upset when he/she is unable to do something that he/she wants to do?

Every child is different. Preventing injury to your child may mean saying no and waiting until the child's abilities develop.

#### What Are The Laws?

Tractor and Machinery Certification is mandated by Federal legislation for any youth 14-15 years old working on a farm not owned or operated by the youth's parents or legal guardians and who are operating tractors over 20 PTO horsepower and/or certain farm equipment.

In Wisconsin, any farm youth under the age of 16 are prohibited from operating agricultural machinery on public roads unless they have completed a Tractor and Machinery Certification Course. A law signed by the Governor in 1998 sets a lower age limit at youth 12 years of age to become certified in tractor and machine operation.

#### What Can You Do?

You can make a difference in the farm injury problem that exists on Wisconsin farms by sending your children to the Tractor and Machinery Certification Course.

#### Some Facts For You To Consider:

- 82% of fatalities involving youth under age 16 result from agricultural equipment.
- Youth under age 14 are involved in nine times as many accidents per exposure hour of tractor driving than tractor operators 25-44 years.
- Youth under age 15 have higher accident rates for operating tractors on public roads.



## **Green Lake County Livestock Tagging**

If you are planning to enter a market animal in the Green Lake County Fair Livestock Auction, then you <u>must</u> send in the form below by <u>March 1<sup>st</sup></u>.

Even if you are only thinking about entering a market animal, you have to complete the form by the deadline. It is better to be safe and timely! There will be a \$10 LATE FEE, per species, per exhibitor, per month charged on all late entries. These fees must be paid when you pick -up your tags. Make checks for late entries payable to: GREEN LAKE COUNTY LIVE-STOCK COMMITTEE.

Selecting an animal or animals for your project is a very important event. Time and care should be taken when animals are selected. Below are some points to consider when selecting a project animal.

- 1. Animals should be healthy and disease free.
- 2. If animals are brought in from other farms, isolate them for at least one (1) month before exposing them to other livestock.
- 3. Select animals of desired confirmation of the species.
- Make sure to ask birthdates, etc., to get some idea of rate of gain of the animal.
- 5. Select an animal of proper size to assure that it will be of proper weight at fair time.
- If animal is purchased, make sure to have the seller fill out the Country of Origin Affidavit/ Declaration form and keep for your own personal records.

Animals that do not reach the required weight by fair will not be sold in the auction.
