TIME TO RE-ENROLL FOR THE 2018-19 4-H YEAR

The 4HOnline database (at the state) will rollover at 11:59 pm on Friday, August 31. <u>Families will not be able to login until the process is completed on Thursday, September 6.</u> Then please follow the instructions below.

OVERVIEW

This document explains the process of a family re-enrolling members and leaders in 4HOnline.

GETTING STARTED

 $To \ get \ started \ with \ the \ re-enrollment \ process, \ log \ into \ 4HOn line \ with \ your \ family \ email \ and \ password.$

On the family home screen, click on the orange button labeled Continue to Family.

On your Member/Volunteer list, find the family member you wish to re-enroll and click on Edit next to their name.

RE-ENROLL Deadline is November 1, 2018 to re-enroll for 2018-19 4-H year.

At the bottom of the next screen, click on the button for Enroll for 2018-19.

If the youth is over 17 years old, a box will appear asking if you wish to enroll as a youth or an adult. If the youth is graduating from 4-H and wants to continue as an adult leader, then choose **Enroll As Adult**, otherwise select **Enroll as Youth**.

You will now see the Personal Information that you entered when you first enrolled. Look over the information and make any corrections. If the youth was in 12th grade last year, you must select the grade for this year, either **Post High School Education** or **Not in School**. When you are done, click on **Continue**.

Next is the Additional Information screen where you will need to accept the agreements and answer the Photo Release and Accommodations questions. Click ${\bf Continue}$ when done.

The Health Form for members is optional at enrollment, but you could be asked to complete it in the future if you attend any events that require one. Click **Continue** when done.

If you are an adult volunteer and see the Volunteer Screening page, then it has been 4 years since the last time a background check has been completed. You need to check over the answers to the questions and correct as needed. This page will only appear every 4 years. Click **Continue** when done.

On the Participation -> Club screen, confirm the correct club is listed. If you serve in a volunteer role (but not as a project leader) click on **Edit** and select the volunteer type. Click on **Update** to save the change. Click on **Continue** when done.

On the Participation -> Projects screen, confirm all the projects you are enrolled in are listed. Add any missing projects. If you are dropping a project, click on **Edit** for that project and then click on **Delete**. After making sure all your projects are listed correctly, click on **Submit Enrollment**.

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4-H ENROLLMENT

4HOnline: https://wi.4honline.com

4HOnline—A Useful Tool for ALL 4-H Families

4HOnline is not just for enrollments! Families can use this web-based program to read their 4-H newsletter, receive communications from the county 4-H office, and update your member's health form for 4-H events. The Green Lake County 4-H Office uses the broadcast email feature to keep 4-H families up to date on important announcements and reminders.

If your address, phone number or email address changes, YOU can enter your email and password to change/update information in your family or member profile.

To complete a youth's Health Form, view the newsletter, or change contact information, just follow these steps:

- 1) Go to https://wi.4honline.com
- 2) Enter your family's email
- 3) Enter the password (the same one used to enroll last fall or whenever you enrolled thru 4HOnline)
- 4) Login and your Family's Page will appear


NEW MEMBERS: (*including Cloverbuds*) should enter their 4HOnline enrollment as soon as they have decided to become members of a club. After you have enrolled, an email message will be automatically sent to the UW-Extension Office. You will remain in the "pending" stage until you are "accepted" and then you will receive a confirmation email that you are accepted. **Deadline for NEW members to enroll is March 1, 2019.**

RE-ENROLLMENTS: The deadline for all youth and volunteers re-enrolling for the 2018-19 4-H year is November 1, 2018.

PROJECTS: You can go in and add or change projects until March 1, 2019.



WHY DO I LEARN BY COMPLETING A 4-H RECORD BOOK

Record books are a valuable part of the 4-H experience. They are intended to help youth develop lifelong skills such as setting goals, planning and organizing, communicating in writing, evaluating effort and progress, record keeping, and much more.

When completed, youth have a valuable record of accomplishments in projects and events that can be referenced when applying for other awards, scholarships, college, or even a job!
