"Good standing" means you have met ALL requirements of your local 4-H club.</li> <li>Watch Every Time Every Ride video on preventing head injuries. This video needs to be watched once in a 4-H member's career.</li> <li>Earn seven (7) points (4-H members in 13<sup>th</sup> grade must earn three (3) points) approved by the Green Lake County 4-H Horse Council by July 1<sup>st</sup>. At least one (1) point must be from attending a Horse Council meeting. For a complete breakdown of points please refer to the Green Lake County 4-H Horse Council Quick Guide. (APPENDIX A)</li> </ul>

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING IDENTIFICATION SHEET Page 2

#### 1. PRINT ALL INFORMATION

- 2. The weight may be estimated, but it is very important that the animal's height is accurate, as this determines the type of classes you enter. If possible, use a measuring stick, and measure on a wood or cement floor. Measure at the highest point of the withers. Any horse measuring 56" (14-0 hands) and under MAY enter in the pony classes, and a miniature horses MUST enter as a pony. Once you have entered a pony division, you must remain in the pony division for the entire show. All ponies and horses entered in the pony classes will be measured when they arrive at the fair. If the animal measures over 56" at fair, the animal will be reentered in the appropriate horse classes. The weight may be estimated.
- 3. Describe the animal markings (star, blaze, etc.). Include scars, brands and other distinguishing features. Example: Half-inch tip of right ear missing.
- 4. If your animal is not a recognized breed, record it as grade or describe the cross if known. Example: Shetland-quarter horse cross, thoroughbred type, unregistered Arab.
- 5. Draw and label all markings in the diagram. Make sure you mark the mane on the correct side.
- 6. Project member must sign the form.
- 7. Obtain your Project Leader's or Chapter Advisor signature.
- 8. This completed form MUST BE SUBMITTED by May 1<sup>st</sup> to the UW-Extension Office.

## GREEN LAKE COUNTY 4-H HORSE COUNCIL CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

#### ARTICLE I: NAME

A. The name of the organization shall be the Green Lake County 4-H Horse Council. From this point on, it shall be referred to as the "Council".

#### ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

- A. The purpose of this program is to help achieve our stated goal by directing the members toward their personal goals relating to the horse project.
- B: Members will be able to enrich their lives, improve their skills, and increase their level of safety through many diverse educational programs.
- C: Youth will have opportunities to strengthen their knowledge and leadership skills by sharing information and fun times with newer members.

#### ARTICLE III: CHARTER

A. The Council is a Chartered 4-H Group. A 4-H Charter indicates the 4-H Club or Group is organized in accordance with objectives of the 4-H program. It authorizes the club or group to use the 4-H Name and Emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

#### **ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP**

- A. Membership is open to all current Green Lake County 4-H members and Green Lake County 4-H volunteers who enroll in the Horse or Horseless Horse project.
- B. Membership in 4-H and this council is open to all persons regardless of age, race, color, creed or religion, national origin, ancestry, gender, sexual orientation, martial or parental status, pregnancy, veterans' status, arrest or non-job program, related conviction record, qualified disability or social economic level. This Council must comply with federal and state nondiscrimination laws, including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, and the American Disabilities Act.

#### ARTICLE V: GREEN LAKE COUNTY 4-H HORSE COUNCIL

A. The powers, property and affairs of the Green Lake County 4-H Horse Council shall be conducted by the Horse Council Board of Directors. From this point on, it shall be referred to as the "Board".

#### ARTICLE VI: HORSE COUNCIL BOARD

A. The Board shall consist of the following elected officers:

Positions:

President (2 year term – odd year election)

Vice President (2 year term – even year election) Adult or Youth

Secretary (2 year term – even year election) <u>Adult or Youth</u>

Treasurer (2 year term – odd year election)

1 – Adult Representative at Large (1 year term)

Youth positions:

- 3 Youth Representatives at Large (1 year terms each)
- B. Officers may be re-elected to succeed themselves upon completing their term.
- C. The Board is empowered to make decisions as designated by the Council.
- D. Officers shall be elected at the Annual Meeting and will begin their duties at the next regularly scheduled meeting.
- E. Whenever any officer vacancies occur, the unexpired term of office will be filled without delay by majority vote of the council.
- F. Duties of Elected Officials:
  - 1. **President:** Oversee all meetings for the project and the leaders in the project to include committees.
  - Vice President: Assist the President as necessary in all duties. Serve in the absence of the President at any general or board of directors meetings.
  - 3. **Secretary:** Record minutes at membership and board of directors meetings. Submit all correspondence for the project. Submit the report to the Extension office.
  - 4. **Treasurer:** Collect and disburse funds as needed. Maintain Records regarding accounts. Oversee committee to develop the annual budget. Coordinate an annual audit of the account consistent with the requirements of the annual charter renewal.
  - 5. **Adult Representative:** Contribute at all board and general meetings. Attend monthly 4-H Leader's Association Meeting. Acquire information on functions, events, awards and recognitions to promote the project to local newspapers and magazines.
  - 6. **Youth Representative:** Contribute at all board and general meetings. Work with other youth reps to assure one person is present at each horse council meeting. Give feedback from youth perspective on topics and discussion. Assist at least one educational program. Acquire information on functions, events, awards and recognitions to promote the project to local newspapers and magazines.

#### **ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS**

- A. There will be an **annual meeting** of the Council in **the fall each year (typically the second Monday of September due to the Labor Day Holiday).** The following business shall be conducted at this meeting.
  - 1. Election of Officers
  - 2. Financial Report
  - 3. Review of operations for the previous year
  - 4. Goals for upcoming year
  - 5. Review Constitution and Bylaws

Quorum for this annual meeting shall consist of at least 2 Officers and the members present in order to conduct official business. All members of the Council are eligible to vote at the annual meeting.

- B. Regular Meetings of the Council
  - 1. The Council shall meet at least 6 times per year, usually on the 1<sup>st</sup> Monday of the odd numbered month.
  - 2. A quorum shall consist of at least 2 officers and the members present in order to conduct official business.

#### **ARTICLE VIII: AWARDS**

A. Presentation of Year End Awards is ideally scheduled on a Sunday in October following the State 4-H Horse Expo.

#### ARTICLE IX: FINANCIAL

- A. An annual budget will be developed by the President and submitted for approval at the Annual Meeting in September.
- B. Upon dissolution of the Green Lake County Horse Council, remaining assets shall be conveyed to a 4-H Youth Development program or 4-H Youth Foundation as selected by affirmative vote of the majority of members entitled to vote.

#### **Article XI: AMENDMENT**

A. The Constitution and Bylaws may be amended at any meeting of the Council where quorum is present by at least two officers and the members present by a two-thirds majority. Proposed amendments must have been presented at a previous meeting and through written notification to members by mail/e-mail before the vote.
