4HOnline: https://wi.4honline.com

4HOnline—A Useful Tool for ALL 4-H Families

4HOnline is not just for enrollments! Families can use this web-based program to read their 4-H newsletter, receive communications from the county 4-H office, and update your member's health form for 4-H events. The Green Lake County 4-H Office uses the broadcast email feature to keep 4-H families up to date on important announcements and reminders.

If your address, phone number or email address changes, <u>YOU</u> will need to go into your family profile and make any and all the necessary changes.

To complete a youth's Health Form, view the newsletter, or change contact information, just follow these steps:

- 1) Go to https://wi.4honline.com
- 2) Enter your family's email
- 3) Enter the password (the same one used to enroll last fall or whenever you enrolled thru 4HOnline)
- 4) Login and your Family's Page will appear


NEW MEMBERS: (*including Cloverbuds*) should enter their 4HOnline enrollment as soon as they have decided to become members of a club. After you have enrolled, an email message will be automatically sent to the Extension Office. You will remain in the "pending" stage until you are "accepted" and then you will receive a confirmation email that you are accepted. **Deadline for NEW members to enroll** (in order to exhibit at the GLC Fair) is March 1, 2020.

RE-ENROLLMENTS: The deadline for all youth and volunteers re-enrolling for the 2019-20 4-H year is **November 1, 2019.**

PROJECTS: You can go in and add or change projects until March 1, 2020.

The National Youth Summit Series brings together some of the best and brightest students to focus on STEM, agriscience, healthy living, and photography. Designed for high school students (grades 9 – 12), the Summits provide opportunities to learn technical skills, participate in hands-on activities, workshops, and engage with nationally-recognized leaders.

Students typically attend in groups comprised of two to eight youth and are accompanied by an adult mentor/chaperone. School year 2019-2020 will be our seventh year of programs and the results have been amazing! In school year 2015-2016 our surveys show up to a 47% increase in the number of students who felt after attending a Summit they were more aware of areas of study they could pursue in college relating to their Summit subject matter. The National Youth Summit Series aims to teach lessons students can use for the betterment of their personal lives and communities.

Green Lake County 4-H'er Calob Congdon and 4-H adult volunteer Emily Strahota have proudly served as members on the 2018-2019 WLC Board.

Emily shared the following information about WLC:

"Wisconsin Leadership Council, also known as WLC, is comprised of 20 youth members and 14 adult members, like Calob and myself from around the state that come together to promote 4-H. We do this through the planning of the Wisconsin 4-H and Youth Conference alongside the other state teams and planning Fall Forum. At Youth Conference, the youth leaders on our team welcome participants, lead them to and from sessions, plan and lead many of the assemblies, lead sessions and develop friendships with participants and other state team youth. We also serve as liaisons to the 4-H Foundation where we represent the youth of 4-H and help with the Governors Blue Ribbon Meat Auction at WI State Fair and the Evening of Art Auction in Madison. These funds are given back to 4-Hers through scholarships for school, educational opportunities and WI agriculture. We have the unique opportunity to discuss ideas and have input in 4-H at the state level through our connections with Extension and our other yearly events. I strongly encourage anyone who is interested in being involved in 4-H at the state level and advocate for 4-H to apply for WLC. Calob reflects on his WLC involvement fondly as he shares:

"I encourage my fellow 4-Hers to apply to be a part of WLC because in my eight years of being in 4-H, I have never once encountered a program where both youth and adults can work together in such a friendly and welcoming capacity to help positively develop our Wisconsin 4-H program and the youth that are a part of it. Being on WLC means that you serve as a role model not only for your county, but your state as you represent all Wisconsin 4-Hers at events like Fall Forum, Youth Conference, and State Fair. It is through your actions that members around the state learn what Wisconsin 4-H can truly do for their lives and how the program impacts their futures."


To be a 4-H adult volunteer leader there are 4 steps required to ensure youth protection. These steps are as follows:



What do I Learn by Completing a 4-H Record Book

Record books are a valuable part of the 4-H experience. They are intended to help youth develop lifelong skills such as setting goals, planning and organizing, communicating in writing, evaluating effort and progress, record keeping, and much more.

When completed, youth have a valuable record of accomplishments in projects and events that can be referenced when applying for other awards, scholarships, college, or even a job!


