## Home Delivered Meals – Senior Dining Program

**Eligibility**: Anyone 60 years and older who is frail and essentially homebound by reason of illness, disability or isolation for whom an assessment concludes that participation is in the individual's best interest. Spouses, a person with a disability under 60, and an informal caregiver may also be eligible.

**Cost:** A suggested donation of \$4.00 per meal for persons over age 60 (or their guests). \$8.32 per meal for persons under age 60.

## Green Lake County Senior Dining Program

**Eligibility:** Anyone 60 years and older is encouraged to participate. If you are homebound, you may qualify to have your meal delivered.

**Cost:** The meal cost is on a donation basis.

#### Family Health/La Clinica WIC Program

The Family Health/La Clinica Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program serves pregnant and postpartum women, infants and children up to 5 years of age.

**Eligibility**: participants must meet both income guidelines (185% of the federal poverty level) and medical/ nutritional guidelines which put them at risk for decreased health and nutrition status. Serves Wautoma, Green Lake, Berlin, Endeavor, Westfield and Montello.

## **Commodity Foods**

Commodity Foods is an emergency food assistance program to area food pantries, facilitated by ADVOCAP. ADVOCAP is not a site for food distribution to individuals.

**Eligiblity**: Participants must meet income guidelines (185 % of federal poverty level), provide proof of Green Lake County residency, identification or documentation identifying each member of the household upon registration. For subsequent visits, identification or documentation for the individual who directly receives the food.



### FoodShare Wisconsin

As of January 3, 2012, the State of Wisconsin changed how it handles FoodShare, health care and Caretaker Supplement cases by merging agencies/counties into groups called consortia. The goal of this change is to improve customer service and better manage enrollment services. Calumet, Green Lake, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Marquette, Outagamie, Sheboygan, Waupaca, Waushara and Winnebago make up the **East Central Consortium**.

To apply for benefits, report changes, ask questions and make an appointment, **contact** the East Central Consortium at 1-888-256-4563, Monday through Friday, 10:00 am to 4:00 pm.
