LIVESTOCK INFORMATION

YQCA Certification

YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals) is a national program that we utilize in Wisconsin for quality assurance education for youth.

All youth who are in the beef, dairy, poultry, rabbit, sheep and swine projects and wanting to participate in the Green Lake County Fair Livestock Auction are required to have the YQCA certification completed annually by July 1.

There are three options for youth to get certified: 1) instructor led, 2) web based, 3) test out online.

Dean Slark, Markesan Ag teacher/FFA adviser, will be conducting a face-to-face training on Wednesday, March 25 at Markesan High School, 6:30 pm. You MUST complete the online registration before attending training.

If you are attending the face-to-face training, make sure to go online and pay before you attend.

To register or complete online training, go to <u>yqca.org</u>. 4-H youth, please remember to sign in using your 4HOnline login information.

WI State 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl

The 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl Contest will be on Saturday April 4, 2020 at UW Madison Soil Sciences Building in Madison, WI. Deadline for registration is March 14, 2020, 5 p.m.


The Dairy Bowl is a "quiz bowl" competition where all questions deal with dairy topics. Competition in the 4-H Dairy Bowl encourages a 4-H member to develop a more complete knowledge of dairy animals and related subjects. This contest provides an educational dairy program for all dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop alertness, self-confidence, teamwork skills, and mastery in the area of dairy science.

Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Teams receive points for correct answers and may lose points for incorrect answers. The team with the highest final score is the winner.

Teams are divided into three age divisions and teams can consist of 3 or 4 members. The junior division are youth who are under 14 years of age as of January 1, 2020. The senior division are youth who are all 14 years of age or older as of January 1, 2020. A mixed team must contain at least one youth from each age division.

Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.
