2020-2021 4-H Year Enrollment!

All returning members, new members and volunteers will need to complete their enrollment electronically through 4-H Online. Members are encouraged to complete their enrollment by November 1st. New members may enroll at anytime during the 4-H year, which runs October 1st- September 31st, and receive most 4-H member benefits. Youth must be enrolled no later than March 1st in order to exhibit as a 4-H member at the current year Green Lake County Fair. All projects must be chosen by March 1st of the current program year.

Current members and leaders, must re-enroll no later than November 1st to continue to be on the mailing list to receive newsletters and 4-H e-mails.

NEW 4HOnline 2.0

Wisconsin 4-H has been using the 4HOnline enrollment system for the last seven years and this fall we will be upgrading to a new version. Improvements include a mobile-friendly design, ADA compliance, and a more user-friendly look.

In preparation for this upgrade, the current system shut down on August 20th. Families will not be able to login until enrollments open in the fall (open date has not been announced).

When enrollments open you will go to the same website, <https://wi.4honline.com>, and login using the same email as your current login. If your login password doesn't work, use the Reset Password link on the login page and you will be emailed a new password. Your enrollment record and history will be there when you get logged in.

We are looking forward to the new version and its easier to use design!

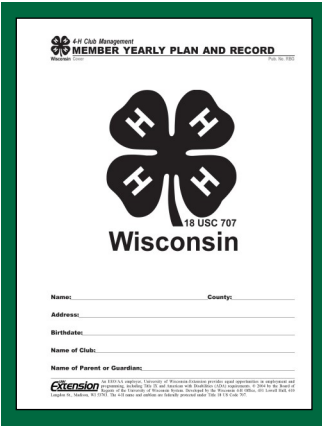

4-H Record Books

Hard to believe that Fall is quickly approaching. With Fall comes a time for 4-H families to take the opportunity to think about the past year and plan for the year ahead. One of the ways we do this is by filling out 4-H Record Books.



I acknowledge that this is not necessarily a favorite activity for both youth or parents and yet it is one way that we can really help our 4-H'ers actively reflect on their 4-H experiences.

Those experiences may have been super positive or been filled with many life lessons and disappointments. All are learn-

ing experiences that help shape our youth for the future.

Those disappointments come in many forms, and 2020 may have included multiple. L

You may ask... what's the point of a Record Book if we didn't have a fair? While fair is something that many of our 4-H members look forward to and participate in, it is only part of the 4-H experience.

There are also various other ways to exhibit or share your projects including a speech or demonstration, alternate show, helping another 4-H member, or other maybe sharing your story via social media or a newspaper article.

One change to note for this years' project pages (animal and non-animal):

- Unfortunately since youth were not able to exhibit at the Green Lake County Fair, due to the cancellation, youth do not need to include any information about their project under the section "Green Lake Fair Exhibit Record For This Project."

Cloverbuds have a special Record Book to complete, if they choose to do one. It can include photos, drawings, and written thoughts about what you liked in 4-H over the past year. Parents and older siblings are encouraged to help Cloverbuds get started on their Record Book.

We do not know if we will be able to hold our annual 4-H Youth Awards Program this Fall to recog-

nize youth receiving county awards. While we are hopeful to have it as usual, we are aware that this probably won't be able to happen. Please know that we will recognize youth receiving these county awards for their hard efforts and growth in their project areas even if it is at a different time or format!

Your club leader and older youth in your club are GREAT resources for completing Record Book pages!

What you need to know:

- Record Books are encouraged for ALL 4-H members
- K-2nd graders are encouraged to fill out the Cloverbud Record Book <https://greenlake.extension.wisc.edu/files/2010/09/Cloverbud-Record-Book.pdf>

- The Extension Office has 3-ring binders to put your Record Book pages inside. If you need a binder, please contact your general leader or the Extension Office
- Check with YOUR CLUB LEADER to learn your club's due date and the process for no-contact drop off of books
- **All Record Books that would like to be considered for county awards are DUE SEPT 18 to the Extension Office**

WI 4-H FAQ's Related to COVID-19- August 7, 2020 Update

For the full update, visit <https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/4-h-faqs-related-to-covid-19/>. Below are some key points pertaining to holding in-person programs.



- Virtual and distance programs are the preferred method for youth programs and participation.
- If your club or group would like to hold an in-person program for a *group*, contact Morgan to work through the program checklist for approval for your event. Leader training, pre-registration, notification and post-event reporting are required. Some criteria for in-person programs include:
 - ⇒ Indoor gatherings are limited to 2 hours.
 - ⇒ 6 feet minimum distancing between participants is required at all times.
 - ⇒ Physical distancing is not required between members of the same household, however each member is counted in the maximum group size.
 - ⇒ Hand sanitizing equipment (soap and water is preferred, or hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, tissues, and no-touch trash cans) must be readily available and frequently used.
 - ⇒ Face masks or coverings are typically required even when speaking.
- A group is defined as 10 people or fewer including all adults and children meeting in one location.
- More than one group (each under 10 individuals) may meet in outdoor or multi-room locations where the groups can remain separated and physically distant.
 - ⇒ Groups may use separate spaces in the same venue such as a school, library or community center where groups remain in different rooms and physically distant throughout the event.
 - ⇒ Groups may use several areas within a park or other large outdoor space.
- Total numbers across all groups may not exceed 50 individuals.
- There must be a minimum of 20 feet between each group of 10 when outdoors.
- Each group must have its own staff/adult leader. Groups must remain together, staff/volunteers and youth cannot rotate between groups during a meeting or activity.

- Plans will include how young people will access the unique spaces without congregating, including parking, drop-off and pick ups.
- When making plans for outdoor gatherings it is important to have a back-up plan in case of bad weather.
- An example of multiple small groups: drive-in style meetings where families remain in their cars.
- Both staff and volunteers are required to follow the guidance of 4-H and UW-Madison Division of Extension. As with all policies, those who do not are subject to disciplinary actions including discharge.

Nancy Zieman 4-H Virtual Community Quilt Project

In celebration of the upcoming premiere of the PBS Wisconsin documentary, Nancy Zieman: Extraordinary Grace, there will be a Nancy Zieman 4-H Virtual Community Quilt Project. Because Nancy's career in sewing was inspired by her youth participation in Wisconsin 4-H, all youth and adult quilters, sewists and fiber artists are invited to contribute a photo of a quilt block to the community quilt. In addition to the 6-1/2-inch fiber art square or quilt block, participants will also be including an artist statement detailing how Nancy and 4-H directed their fiber arts journey and/or career path. This virtual community quilt will be a photo collage and will be shared as part of the virtual experience. You'll also be able to scroll through and read stories from participants across the country whose lives have been impacted by Nancy and/or 4-H, at QuiltShow.com, Sept. 10-12, 2020.

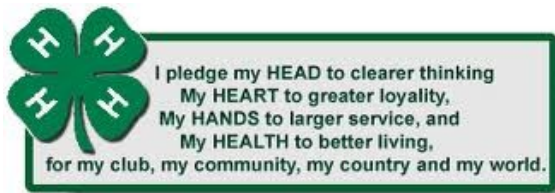

4-H Clubs to Create Newest Cedar Crest Ice Cream Flavor: Entries Now Being Accepted

[Cedar Crest Ice Cream](#), Cedarburg, Wisconsin, and the [Wisconsin 4-H Foundation](#) have teamed up again to present the "Cedar Crest Ice Cream 4-H Flavor Contest" for Wisconsin 4-H clubs. More than 1600 clubs are eligible to create and submit a flavor 'recipe' with the top clubs named as finalists, and the top flavor produced for summer 2021.



According to Brenda Scheider, Executive Director of the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation, the contest is a great opportunity for 4-H youth to work together to develop and name their flavor. "The most exciting part of the contest is the winning flavor will be available through Cedar Crest beginning next July." The annual contest has already yielded popular flavors including Deep Woods, created by the Badger Boosters 4-H Club of West Bend and Wisconsin Campfire S'mores, created by the Springbrook 4-H Club of New Richmond. This year's winning flavor was Road Trip Wisconsin, created by the Trail Blazers 4-H Club of Holmen in LaCrosse County.

A panel of ice cream experts chosen by Cedar Crest judges the entries. The company manufactures more than 80 flavors of ice cream, along with frozen custard, sherbet and sorbet at its Manitowoc, Wisconsin, plant, and distributes products in five states. Many of the flavors now produced by Cedar Crest, including Wisconsin Campfire S'mores and Big Muddy, are a result of the contest.

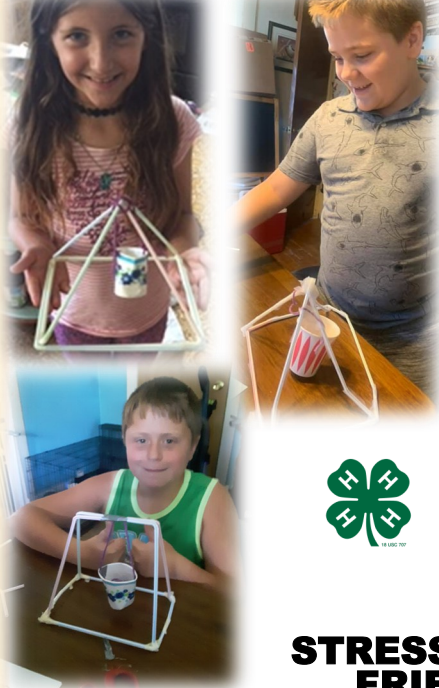

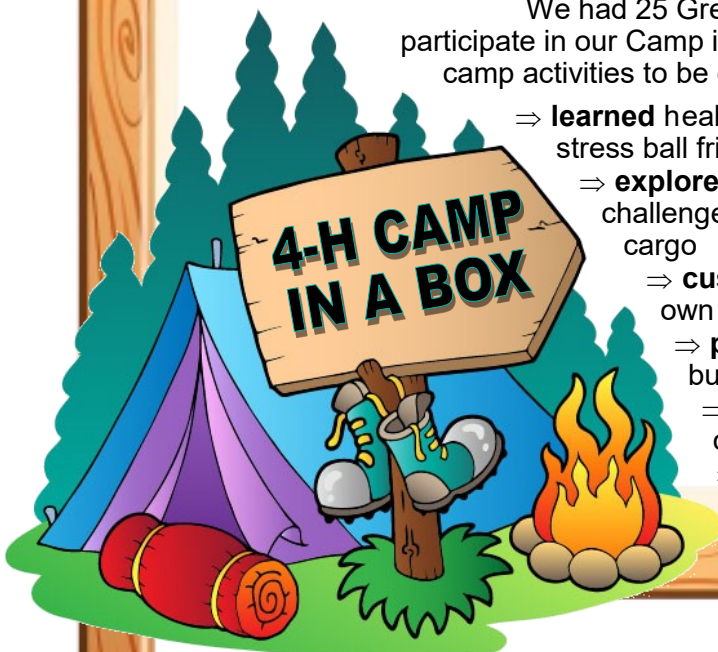

#1 Wear Your 4-H Gear

Nothing says 4-H pride like a 4-H tee! Dress yourself (or the entire family – pets included!) in 4-H green and clover gear, available at Shop 4-H.

#2 Set Up Information Booths

If your local library allows, set up a table to share information about your local 4-H program or club. You can display 4-H posters, brochures, or showcase the work of local 4-H'ers.

#3 Shout-Out a 4-H'er
