



To: Swine, Sheep, Beef Exhibitors who completed 2021 GLC Fair Tagging Form

With working toward keeping everyone safe, it has been determined NOT to complete on-farm animal tagging done by 4-H volunteers, however animals will still need to be identified. Instead, youth must identify their animals by putting provided Green Lake County Fair ear tags in the market animal's ear and submit animal identification.

Tagging Pick-Up:

Beginning April 1st, tagging packets labeled with family name can be picked up at Green Lake County Extension Office Conference Room (walk in Extension Office and conference room is located immediately to the right). The Extension Office is open Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. If unable to pick-up, contact the Extension Office for mailing option.

Tagging Rules:

- Green Lake County Fair Auction Tags may only be used for the year that those tags were issued. Green Lake County Fair Auction Tag colors will be changed on an annual basis to avoid any duplicate numbers as animals are processed
- Lost Tags must be reported to the Green Lake County Extension Office immediately after the tag is lost. A new tag will be issued along with a new Animal ID Sheet. The lost tag must be replaced and the Animal ID sheet must be submitted to the Green Lake County Extension Office before that animal reaches the Green Lake County Fair.
- The Green Lake County Livestock Council will accept Wisconsin State Fair RFID tags in place of a Green Lake County Fair Auction Tag.

Animal Identification: Due April 30, 2021 at 11:59 p.m.

How To Submit Your Identification Information And Photos:

In addition to self-tagging, youth must complete and submit Green Lake County Fair Animal Identification (including a photo clearly displaying the ear tag number) for each animal (beef, sheep, swine) being sold at the Green Lake County Fair Auction. **The animal identification must be submitted by April 30, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. Late forms will not be accepted.**

Online Submission: Complete one Google Form for **EACH ANIMAL** you are identifying. The Google Form link is located on the Livestock Council website or at http://bit.ly/Animal_ID_Form After submission of your Google Form, you will need to upload photo(s) that clearly displays animal AND ear tag number. Instructions for how to upload animal photo(s) is provided in the Google Form.
