Celebrating Wisconsin 4-H Youth Beef Exhibitors Wisconsin 4-H Foundation and Wisconsin Beef Council Host Youth Beef Farmer Highlight Contest

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation and Wisconsin Beef Council announced a social media contest that will feature Wisconsin 4-H Beef Exhibitors throughout the month of July. Community members, family, and friends will have the opportunity to nominate a 4-H member who has achieved outstanding work during their time in the program.

In the past four years, the Wisconsin 4-H Beef Project has averaged 3,500 participants per year. Up to 2020, the number of participants have steadily increased, making the beef project one of the most popular programs in the state. 66 out of the 72 Wisconsin counties have an active 4-H Beef Program. The Wisconsin 4-H Program serves around 30,000 youth across the state.

The contest will end on July 31st, with the announcement of the winner on August 1st. Nominees must be a Wisconsin 4-H member and enrolled in the Wisconsin Beef Project.



4-H Record Books

It is hard to believe that with summer just beginning, fall will be here before we know it! With Fall comes a time for 4-H families to take the opportunity to think about the past year and plan for the year ahead. One of the ways we do this is by completed a 4-H Record Book.



The 4-H program has a long history of record keeping. The focus reflects the importance of this life skill in our daily lives. In 4-H, young people have tracked their activities, events, profits and losses, skill development and learning experiences, and much more using the iconic 4-H Record Book. In addition to record keeping, the 4-H Record Book gives members an opportunity to reflect on their year, measure their achievements and growth, and set goals, and develop plans to meet those goals.

The 4-H Record Book pages have been updated for 2021! While the pages have a new appearance, 4-H'ers still share the same amazing ways they have given back to their community, reflect on their project goals, progress of meeting set goals, and sharing the story of their 4-H year.

Cloverbuds have a special record book to complete, if they choose to do one. It can include photos, drawings, and written thoughts about what you liked in 4-H over the past year. Parents and older siblings are encouraged to help Cloverbuds get started on their record book.

Club leaders and other youth are also GREAT resources for completing Record Book pages! All 4-H members are encouraged to complete a 4-H Record Book.

All Record Books that would like to be considered for county level awards are due to the Extension Office by September 10. Please check with your club leader to learn your club's due date and the process for getting your Record Book to your club leader to be evaluated.

4-H Does STEM Clover String Art

String art involves wrapping colorful string around nails or pins to form a design. String art can also be used to teach math! It's a great way to learn about shapes if you're younger and to



learn a little about geometry if you're older. String art can be simple, or more complex. For example, the clover you can make with these instructions might look difficult, but if you separate it into more simple shapes, you will see that you can do it (each leaf is like a heat).

States' 4-H Global Exploration Series

This summer, State' 4-H Exchange is organizing a free virtual trip around the world!! During the month of June they traveled to Taiwan and Japan and in July, they are inviting YOU (youth ages 9-18) to explore Norway (Thursday, July 15, 11:00am) and Korea (Wednesday, July 28, 7:00pm). In August, they will be off exploring Argentina and Egypt.





Barn Information at the Fair

Stall assignments: will be ready at Fair Set-up Night. **Bedding:** All exhibitors are required to provide their own bedding at the fair. Sawdust is preferred and recommended.

Decorating: Clubs are responsible for bringing their own supplies to decorate their club areas in the barns (staplers, markers, tape, scissors, etc.). The Fair Office will not lend out any supplies. When decorating or hanging anything in the barns, please be extremely careful. This includes making sure that no nails or other potentially hazardous materials fall where any animals or people may be harmed by them, including neighboring feed areas. For the safety of all exhibitors and livestock, use discretion in decorating.

Closing time for all barns: 10:00 p.m. Exhibitors are to have cared for animals and exited the buildings by this time.

CLUB BOOTH & BARN DECORATION REIMBURSEMENT




