In your role as a youth activity staff member or volunteer, it is important to understand the following terms:

- **custodial care:** The responsibility for the care, supervision, guidance, or control of minor(s) on a temporary basis.
- **youth activity:** An intentional interaction between one or more youth and a University employee or University appointed volunteer, and is sponsored or operated in part or in whole by the University, regardless of location or duration.
- **minor/youth:** A person under the age of eighteen (18).
