# Dalton Doers




# Grand River Workers

## **Display Rules:**

- 1. Displays should be in place from June 1-15, 2024. (or longer with owner's consent)
- 2. Must use the Theme in your display.
- 3. One Business per 4-H club. If more than one window is done, Judge the windows and award for the best one, additional \$10.00 per window if they receive a Blue Ribbon.
- 4. Dairy products exhibited in the window display must not reveal name brands.
- 5. Use only REAL dairy products in your display. (No margarine, artificial cream, etc.)
- 6. Please use pride in preparing your display. Use Color! Check your spelling and neatness!
- 7. Cash prizes of \$20, \$15, and \$10 will be awarded. Ratings will be excellent, good and fair. In addition, each club will receive a monetary gift from the Green Lake County Dairy Promotion Committee and DFW (Dairy Farmers of Wisconsin).
- 8. Please put your Club information and phone who to contact on your window. If there is information not on your window, 10 points will be deducted from your score.

# Project Enhancement Program

The Green Lake County Leaders Association is proud to offer youth the opportunity to develop their interests in their 4-H projects through a local grant. This grant is available to any 4-H youth who is enrolled in Green Lake County 4-H. Grants will be available to use for any project with reimbursement up to \$100 dollars in increments of \$25. This can be used for anything that would help enhance your project (i.e. art supplies, money toward a woodworking tool, halters, grooming supplies, show supplies, baking ingredients, or dishes etc.) To apply for this grant, youth will need to write an essay about how the grant will improve their project and fill out the attached information sheet. Each member may submit up to \$100 each year. Money should be focused to one project area however members can re-apply for the project enhancement grant in the future for other projects. Member are limited to one application per calendar year. The Leader's Assocation will provide up to \$1,000 in total for grants this year. Priority will be given to first time applicants. Applications will be judged based on a set standard rubric.

Following the used of the money a receipt will need to be provided to the leaders Assocation for proof of purchase. Receipts must be turned in by August 31st.


