

# GENERAL REMINDERS

## **TAKE DOWN**

- No supplies or decoration can be removed from the barn prior to 4:15pm on Sunday. If decorations are removed prior all of your premiums will be revoked.

## **BARN CLEANOUT**

- All species need to clean bedding out of barns prior to leaving the fair on Sunday. This will not be completed by maintenance.

# Dairy

## ARRIVAL

- Dairy should arrive anytime until 10pm on Wednesday, July 31st.
- Know your animal classes at arrival and let Kim or Emily know.

## SHOW TIMES

- The dairy show will be held following the dairy goat show
- The show order will be
  - Cows
  - Calves
  - Showmanship

## ID FORM

- Animal Identification Forms need to be turned into your superintendent PRIOR to unloading on Wednesday, July 31st. You will not be allowed to unload until this form is collected.

## MILKING TIMES

- 6:30-7:30AM and 5:30-7:30PM daily other than show day
- Show day milking times will be determined day of, or closer to the fair
- If you need another milking time, please talk to Kim and Emily

## ANIMAL COUNT

- Contact Kim by **July 22** with the number of animals you plan to bring. It is your responsibility to contact Kim to ensure your spot in the dairy barn.

# GOATS

## ARRIVAL

- Meat goats should arrive between 9am and noon. (If you need an earlier time talk to Ben or Mckenna)
- They must be at the fair by NOON on Wednesday, July 31st. **Find Ben or Mckenna prior to unloading.**

## IDENTIFICATION

- All MARKET goats must have a scrapies tag. The superintendents must check your animals before you unload.

## SHOW TIMES

- Classes will be posted at 7:30am on Thursday
- Showmanship - all goat showmanship classes will be judged prior to the sheep show

## AUCTION

- Goats to be sold in the auction must be a meat goat breed. Wethers and does are allowed to be sold in the auction. Any goat sold in the auction must have a Green Lake County Fair Livestock Auction Tag and completed Animal Identification Form. Market goats must be born on December 1 or after of that current year. Must weigh a minimum of 50lbs. You must complete all auction requirements (see livestock handbook)

## WEIGH-IN

- Weigh in will start at 1PM, beginning with sheep, followed by goats, then swine, and ending with beef.

# SWINE

## ARRIVAL

- The barn will open at 7am for exhibitors to start arriving. All swine must arrive by NOON on Wednesday, July 31st.

## CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (CVI)

- A CVI is required to unload at the fair
  - A statement that a veterinarian has inspected the entire herd of origin within the past 30 days before the show and that was apparent disease was present at the time of inspection
- **If the above statement is not present on the CVI, you will not be allowed to unload!**

## WEIGH-IN

- Weigh in will start at 1PM, beginning with sheep, followed by goats, then swine, and ending with beef.

## AUCTION REQUIREMENTS

- Swine must weigh 230lbs to participate in the auction.
- Swine exceeding 325lbs will not be eligible for the auction.

## SHOW DISQUALIFICATIONS

- Swine exceeding 325 at weigh in will not be eligible to participate in the swine show.

## IDENTIFICATION

- All swine must have a Green Lake County or WI State Fair Tag

## FORMS

- Animal Identification and Country of Origin Certification Forms need to be turned into your superintendent **PRIOR** to unloading on Wednesday, July 31st. You will not be allowed to unload until these forms are collected.

# BEEF

## ARRIVAL

- The barn will open at 7am for exhibitors to start arriving. All beef need to be in place by NOON on July 31st!

## AUCTION REQUIREMENTS

- Beef steers must weigh 1,000lbs to participate in the auction.
- Dairy steers must weigh 1,100lbs to participate in the auction.

## IDENTIFICATION

- All steers must have a Green Lake County tag or WI State Fair Tag
- Heifers must be identified by an official form of identification

## FORMS

- Animal Identification and Country of Origin Certification Forms need to be turned into your superintendent **PRIOR** to unloading on Wednesday, July 31st. You will not be allowed to weigh in unless forms are turned in.

## WEIGH-IN

- Weigh in will start at 1PM, beginning with sheep, followed by goats, then swine, and ending with beef.

## RULES

- Please review the Fair book to ensure all rules are being followed
- All animals **MUST** be double tied

# SHEEP

## ARRIVAL

- The barn will open at 7am for exhibitors to start arriving. All sheep need to be in place by NOON on July 31st!

## AUCTION REQUIREMENTS

- Sheep must weigh 110lbs to participate in the auction.

## IDENTIFICATION

- All sheep must have a scrapies tag.

## FORMS

- Animal Identification and Country of Origin (COOL) Forms need to be turned into your superintendent **IN ORDER** to weigh in on Wednesday, July 31st. You will not be allowed to weigh in until these forms are collected.

## WEIGH-IN

- Weigh in will start at 1PM, beginning with sheep, followed by goats, then swine, and ending with beef.

# RABBITS

## ARRIVAL

- All rabbits should be in place no later than 6PM on Wednesday, July 31st.

## AUCTION REQUIREMENTS

- Rabbits must weigh no more than 5lbs to participate in the auction

## SET UP

- The Poultry and Rabbit Barn set up will be on fair setup night, Thursday, July 25 from 6:30pm to 8:30pm. All rabbit exhibitors should plan to attend and help with setup of the pens.

# POULTRY

## ARRIVAL

- All poultry should be in place no later than 6PM on Wednesday, July 31st.

## AUCTION REQUIREMENTS

- Roaster (2 birds) must each be over 5 pounds
- Broilers (2 young birds) must each be 2 1/2 - 4 pounds
- Young turkey must be over 15 weeks
- Pen of ducks (2 ducks) must be each over 5 pounds

## SET UP

- The Poultry and Rabbit Barn set up will be on fair setup night, Thursday, July 25 from 6:30pm to 8:30pm. All poultry exhibitors should plan to attend and help with setup of the pens.
