About 4-H

What is 4-H? 4-H is the nation's largest youth development organization serving more than six (6) million youth across 90,000 clubs in the United States. 4-H started because youth were a great tool in implementing new agricultural practices from universities. 4-H has grown and changed to provide of programming to prepare youth to be Beyond Ready for their futures.

What do the 4 "H"s stand for? The 4 "H"s stand for head, heart, hands, and health. The 4-H Pledge, which kicks off 4-H events says, "I pledge my head to clearer thinking, my heart to great loyalty, my hands to larger service, and my health to better living for my club, my community, my country and my world."

This commitment that 4-H'ers make is to taking their learning beyond just the 4-H program and back into their communities.

What is the 4-H Thrive Model?




What are "Sparks"?

Sparks are interests or passions that youth can explore and grow throughout 4-H. Youth explore their sparks through their club meetings, project learning days (Spark Sessions/Super Saturday), and different 4-H experiences.

What is "Beyond Ready"?

Although not an official part of the thrive model. 4-H has a new intiative to prepare youth to be Beyond Ready for education, jobs, and their life after 4-H. The focus is making sure that youth have the skills and experiences they need to not only be ready, but to be Beyond Ready for all the life has in store.

How to join 4-H?


- 1. Find a 4-H Club: 4-H Club meeting are the backbone of 4-H. They meet monthly and are the place where leading, learning, and laughing take place. To learn more about Green Lake County 4-H Clubs, check out the 4-H Club Contact Information Page!
- 2. Enroll: Now that you found a 4-H club for you, the next step is to enroll. Head over to 4HOnline and fill out the members information!

- **3. All Set:** Once your enrollment is approved in 4-H Online, you are officially a 4-H member!
- 4. News: Now that you're enrolled, you should receive broadcasts from 4HOnline to your email with important information. They appear to come from "RegMax" which is the company owns 4-H Online. Sometimes they end up in the "Junk" folder, so watch out!




Picking your Projects:

There are tons of different project areas that you can explore in 4-H! Check out the <u>Wisconsin 4-H Project</u> <u>Guide</u> to help you discover your spark!

Spark Areas:

New this year, all the projects will fall into 6 project spark areas.

- 1. Ag & Animal Science: Youth will get the chance to explore things like raising healthy animals for fun or food, riding horses, caring for pets, or teaching dogs new tricks.
- 2. Environmental/Outdoor Education: Youth will get to explore riding ATVs and snowmobiles, learning about insects, hiking, adventure sports, and protecting the environment.
- **3. Plant & Soil Science:** Youth will get to explore growing vegetables or flowers, growing crops, learning about soil, or creating fairy gardens.
- **4. Leadership and Community:** Youth will explore helping younger members, being camp counselor, leading and organizing events, exploring cultures, and working on teams for special projects!
- **5. STEM:** Youth will explore building with LEGO®, problem solving, working with engines or electricity, exploring space, coding, robots, and building things.
- **6. Expressive Arts:** Youth will exploring making scrapbooks, collecting things, drawing or doing crafts, taking pictures, playing with puppets, or acting and singing.




Getting Involved in 4-H

There are many ways to get involved in 4-H from the comfort of your own home to traveling across the US. These are a few ways to get involved in 4-H:

- **1. 4-H At Home:** From working on a project to distance 4-H programs to take home kits, there are many ways to bring 4-H into your home. At home is also the time for 4-H'ers to reflect and apply their learning from 4-H programs.
- 2. 4-H Community Clubs: Joining a club for monthly meetings gets youth the opportunity to build those important leadership skills. Youth will lead meetings, make decisions, meet new people and more.
- **3. Ambassadors:** Once youth get older, they are able to help support Green Lake County 4-H programs by becoming an Ambassador. Gain leadership experience, provide a say in county-wide programming, and meeting people from across the county.
- **4. GLC 4-H Leaders' Association:** This is a great chance for older youth and adult volunteers to support the county 4-H program. This group is dedicated to support GLC 4-H!
- 5. Wisconsin 4-H Leadership Council: Take leadership to the next level. Meet people from across the state while planning statewide 4-H programs. Attend various events like Fall Forum and Summer Academy as a WLC member!
